

# HOW MUCH IS *enough?*

According to a study done at Princeton University<sup>1</sup> in 2010, most Americans report a high sense of emotional well being when they make about \$75,000. The study showed that people who made more than \$75K/year had an emotional well-being that corresponded to their individual temperaments and life circumstances rather than any extra income. And for those who made less than \$75K/year, people reported falling levels of happiness, high levels of sadness and stress. There was also greater instances of disease, divorce, sickness, and painful experiences.

The results of the study:

“High incomes don’t bring you happiness, but they do bring you a life that you \_\_\_\_\_ is better.”

In other words, happiness is less dependent on the amount of money you have, and **very dependent upon what you think about it.**
